

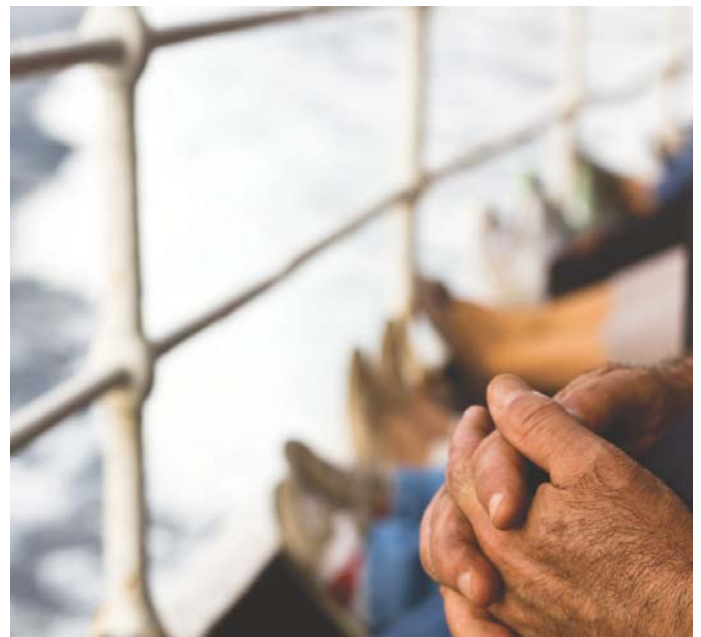


Refugee & Asylum Seeker Experiences 1 DAY WORKSHOP

This one day workshop provides a comprehensive introduction to working with people from a refugee background, including asylum seekers. Participants will gain knowledge of refugee and asylum seeker experiences and ways of working with this highly vulnerable group. Establishing positive working relationships and maintaining worker resilience in a challenging environment are covered.

- An outline of Australia's humanitarian program within a global context
- The Foundation House framework for recovery and how this applies in the workplace
- The psychosocial effects of traumatic experiences on individuals, families and communities
- A reflection on how we understand what is called 'culture'
- The psychological impact of detention and prolonged uncertainty in seeking asylum
- A reflection on the impact of working with trauma, professional boundaries and locating ourselves in the work
